


General Information for Educators




Scheduling Your Tour

As always, planning ahead is the key to ensuring an enjoyable educational experience for all.

To make a reservation for an educational tour, please contact us at least two-four weeks prior to the desired date of your visit. We can accommodate groups up to sixty students at a time. The tour will be a 60-90 minute narrated walk through our new museum exhibits, outside trails, kiva, mural and art room.

The museum, main interpretive trail, and restroom facilities are all handicap accessible.

There are picnic tables in front of the main building and along the river, if you choose to bring lunches to eat on site!

Please plan on a teacher/ chaperone ratio of one for each ten students. We welcome church groups, home school associations, and mentoring programs as well as classrooms.

All school groups are FREE, including adult chaperones.

Choose Your Emphasis

Your students need not be experts on the archeology of our site before they come – but it will be helpful if you review lessons and vocabulary available on our website before you arrive.

We ask you to tell us what emphasis you would like rangers to emphasize or avoid. We are respectful of cultural sensitivities, so share your ideas with us and we will do our best to give your students the tour which best fits your educational goals.

Our areas of interpretation emphasize the ancestral Puebloan lifeways and the Spanish Colonial exploration and settlement.
